REGULATIONS

1. All entries in this division and premiums awarded will be governed by general rules and regulations on the previous pages of this catalog. Each exhibitor must furnish their own paper plates or containers for their displays.
2. Entries in this division must be made Tuesday, August 3rd from 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.
3. A single exhibit cannot be entered in more than one class. All grains and seeds must have been grown by the exhibitor in the year 2009, excepting those that not having maturity, in which case 2008 crops may be shown.
4. Only one entry can be made in any one class by an exhibitor.
5. An ear of corn in any exhibit may not have more than one percent of its grain missing.
6. No exhibitor may change his exhibit or any part thereof after the hour designated for same to be in place.
7. Exhibits and premiums may be picked up Saturday, August 7th from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m.
8. Where there is only one entry in a class, awards will be made on the quality of the item exhibited.
