JUDGING & PREMIUMS

a. All judging and exhibits will be done on the basis of the Danish System, which includes Gold, Silver and Bronze ribbon groups.

- b. The prize money will be divided according to the number of exhibits in the show. Gold, Silver, and Bronze ribbon winners will receive the points indicated in the premium list. The total points awarded will be divided into the total money to determine the value of the point.
- c. In no case shall the point value be equal to more than sixty cents (60¢).
- d. The judges are authorized not to place inferior animals regardless of the number of entries.

INTERPRETATION OF RULES

The North Central Missouri Fair reserves to its executive committee the absolute and final right to interpret all rules and regulations governing the Fair, to arbitrarily settle and determine all matter, questions and differences in regard hereto or arising out of, connected with or incident to the Fair.

LIVESTOCK RULES & REGULATIONS

4-H & FFA Livestock will show together

1. Entries for livestock will be made upon arrival at Fair.
2. All livestock will be assigned pens or stalls as animals arrive. Upon arrival pay your stall or pen rent at the Fair office and receive your entry form and official entry card for the show ring.
3. To be eligible for competition animals must be the bonafide property of the exhibitor, and a registration certificate in their recognized breed association must be produced, showing the exhibitor to be the owner.
4. Exhibitors must be in ownership of exhibited animals as follows:
 - Beef Cattle-owned June 1 or prior
 - Dairy Cattle-owned June 1 or prior
 - Goat & Sheep-owned July 1 or prior
 - Swine-owned May 1 or prior
5. Only two animals will be allowed to show in each class by one exhibitor. Exceptions: A maximum of 10 market animals of one breed may be shown by one exhibitor, with no more than 2 animals in any weight class.
6. Exhibitors must accompany, care for and show their animals. In case of illness or severe cases of hardship making this impossible, another member may act.
7. All exhibitors are subject to conformance with the general rules and regulations of the show. The livestock committee shall have the authority to disqualify any exhibitor who does not cooperate in placing animals in proper stalls and the authority to remove trucks or trailers from no parking areas.
8. Since no exhibitors tickets are required, stall and pen rent will be charged. Charges for pens and stalls are:
 - Beef Cattle and Dairy- \$3.00 per head
 - Goat, Sheep & Hogs- \$2.00 per head
 - Horses- \$10.00 per head pre-registered
 - \$15.00 per head the day of the show. (Showmanship excluded)
 - (All pens and stalls assigned by Supt.)
9. No gilts may be shown in the market barrow class.

10. No single animal may be shown in both the breeding classes and the market animal classes.
11. If class is not in the book for your breed of livestock, you must notify the superintendent at the time of registration.
12. All FFA and 4-H exhibitors must be members in good standing in their local chapter or club and with their respective state organizations. All animals exhibited must be a part of their supervised farming and project program. All records or reports as required by their respective organizations must be kept.
13. Livestock exhibitors parking available in high school parking lot or the football stadium parking lot.
14. All registration papers and tattoos may be checked by the livestock committee.
15. No trophies may be given without consent of NCM Fair.
16. Livestock will be shown in class as entered.
17. If animal has no registration papers it will be shown as a crossbred.
18. All animals must have a health certificate unless specifically exempted. Animals with ringworm lesions or easily visible warts will not exhibit.
 - a. Cattle- no health certificate or testing is required.
 - b. Swine- No health certificate or testing is required. Animals must be individually identified.
 - c. Sheep & Goats- health certificate required. All sheep and goats must be free of clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease. Except for castrated males, they must be identified to flock or origin using official ID (ear tags or tattoos) and listed individually on a health certificate.
 - d. Horses- all equidae to be exhibited must be free of clinical signs of an infections or contagious disease. They also need proof of a negative Equine Infections Anemia test within 12 months prior to exhibition. No health certificate required.
19. All sheep, except for wethers must be individually identified with tags or tattoos consistent with the rules set forth by the Scrapie Eradication Program. Sheep not properly identified WILL NOT be allowed to show in accordance with federal regulations.
20. Any situation not covered in these rules will be handled according to the rules of the Missouri State Fair. However, the North Central Missouri Fair reserves the right to interpret all rules and regulations and their decisions will be final.

SPECIAL 4-H RULES

- a. 4-H members living in counties which are north of I-70 or counties which I-70 goes through & Pettis County are eligible to show by complying with the following requirements.
- b. Exhibitors must be enrolled with their names on the official club enrollment at their County University Extension Center as of July 1, 2007 for the livestock shown.
- c. Partnership livestock registered in parents and son or parents and daughter name, or in a farm name is not eligible to show.
- d. 4-H members who own breeding livestock in partnership may have them registered jointly-and each member may show the same number of head as if the animals were individually owned. Entry sheets must identify which animals are to be shown by each exhibitor.
- e. Animals belonging to 4-H'ers in military service are ineligible to show.
- f. There will be 4-H bull classes.
- g. No 4-H Junior Project members may exhibit livestock, except the bucket calf show.

SPECIAL FFA RULES

- a. PARTNERSHIP LIVESTOCK-FFA members who own livestock in partnership may have them registered jointly and each member may show the same number of head as he could if they were individually owned. However, the entry sheets must show which animals are to be exhibited by each member.
If an FFA member is in partnership with a non-FFA member, the local advisor must submit a detailed explanation at the time of making entries. This explanation will be the basis for approval or disapproval of the entry.

SWINE

Class codes will be the same for all breeds except a letter will be added to each class to designate the breed (as designed in the breed codes.)

Example: Hamp market barrow will be classed as 320-H.

BUCKET CALF SHOW

Dairy type 1-D Beef type 2-B
Calves will be shown in conjunction with the Dairy Show & Beef Show, calves may be shown only in one division.

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Exhibitors must be 5 yrs. old or older.
2. Calf must be born between March 1, 2008 & May 15, 2008.
3. Calf must be owned and hand fed by exhibitor since 2 weeks of age.
4. Calf may be any breed: heifer, steer or bull.
5. Calf is not eligible to be shown in other classes (Beef or Dairy).
6. Calf is to be weaned at fair time.
7. Calf should be broke to lead and shown by proper methods according to breed (Beef or Dairy).
8. Classes will be broken by exhibitors age if necessary.
9. Criteria for judging
 - 25% Showmanship
 - 25% Condition, health and grooming of calf
 - 20% Quality of calf (structural soundness, etc.)
 - 30% Records & knowledge (judge will talk with exhibitor)

Example: a) breed; b) age; c) feeding practices; d) growth records (measurements of height, chest circumference and/or weight); e) medical Records (vaccinations, de-wormings, etc.)

MARKET LAMB RULES

1. Ewe lambs may be shown in the market lamb classes. Ewe lambs shown in the market lamb show will not be eligible to show in the breeding stock show.
2. All market lambs must be slick sheared to show, including all areas above the hock/knee and from the ears back.

LADIES LEAD CLASS

The purpose of this class is to present a class of ewes in the most attractive manner, to give spectators an opportunity to view a class of beauty, with beauty, and to acquaint the public with modern sheep production. Contestant must wear wool or wool blend outfits.

ANY BREED of ewes must be conditioned and fitted for show and trained to lead at halter. Other rules for exhibiting sheep at the North Central Missouri Fair pertain.

Entrants chosen by sponsoring exhibitors for this class must be young ladies age 8 through 15 Junior Division, and age 16-21 Senior Division. The entrant will be judged on her outfit and appearance, which must be appropriate, attractive and lend elegance to the class.

Entrant must furnish own attire.

Judging Standards:

1. Entrant's attire
2. Entrant's poise and appearance.
3. Entrant's control and presentation of ewe
